Take a cake and raise Global Goals awareness

Three girls at Lower Site have put their aprons on in a bid to raise awareness of Global Goals.

The Leaders believe the Global Goals for sustainable development are attainable in all countries, for everyone.

However, they say, 'if the Goals are going to work, everyone needs to know about them'. With that in mind, Mia Hopkins, Felicity Kirwan and Orla Murdoch (all 8E), set about raising awareness with a cake sale with a difference.

They baked cakes, each with a number on, which represents one of the Goals. During a breaktime earlier this month, they gave away the cakes but asked the recipients to think about what they will do to help raise awareness and achieve the Goal that matched the number on their cake.

News in brief


