Our 6th Form students turned protesters recently as they produced artwork against injustice.

Students chose topics as diverse as world peace, body shaming, racism and equality before setting about getting their message across via the medium of art.

Among those taking part was Emily Hogan (12S), who explained more about the work she helped produce. She said: "During NOCN week, we had a day creating protest art. My group decided to base ours on world peace. We painted the world with a peace sign in it and then wrote messages around the outside such as 'equality' and 'racism'." Overseeing the event was Head of RE, Mr Moorhead. He said: "Having had sessions that discussed being a positive change maker, we looked about how we could make a statement using art to express our feelings." "Guided by the Holy Spirit, the students in Years 12 created Christian protest art.

"Their Art teachers, Ms Yoxall, Miss Burke and Miss Murphy, were very impressed by their creativity and optimistic vision.
