Year 8 were raising funds for CAFOD during Lent

'Lent is a time for prayer, fasting and for raising money for those in need' says Chaplaincy Coordinator, Mrs Laybourne. She said 'This Lent, students raised money for some of the poorest people in the world. On 14 June, Dr Richard Cooke came in from CAFOD to receive a cheque for £1000 and to deliver an assembly to Year 8 about the work of CAFOD and how their donation would help those in greatest need'. Mr Hurst's classes in RE were inspired by the campaigns CAFOD carry out, not only here but around the world. She added 'Sponsored silences were the vehicle that enabled classes to respond to the needs of our brothers and sisters who find themselves in difficult situations'. Mr Moorhead's classes gave birthday money and donations to show their commitment to helping the poor. Miss Coventry's classes created a hunger cloth with messages of hope and love and took part in a rich man / poor man meal of soup and a bread roll to emphasise how many people go hungry worldwide. Mrs Laybourne said 'My own classes raised funds by creating their own smoothies, cake sales and sponsored events'. Inspired by Jesus' teaching to 'Love your neighbour as yourself', a very healthy amount of £1000 was raised which will empower CAFOD to carry out the mission of the church, demonstrating how our pupils live out the school motto of 'Caring and achieving excellence within a Christian community'.
