We're batty about tech



Our Year 7 & 8 students have gone batty over their environmentally friendly Technology lessons recently.

Throughout June, the students have been working on a theme which encourages supporting the environment.

It is a topic which Sacred Heart supports and has lots of current activities in which it is helping to promote this within the surrounding neighbourhood and local primary schools.

Overseeing the lessons was Technology teacher, Mr Hook, who explains more: "We came up with the idea that Year 8 could make and take home bat boxes to encourage and support bats in the local environment.

"Meanwhile, Year 7 were given the opportunity to make and take home bird boxes to encourage the nesting of small birds.

Opportunity

"The hope was students would experience using machines and tools they have not previously used, as well as having fun learning more about how to support the environment. "The students were given the opportunity to use machines, such as the disc sander, the pillar drill and cordless drill, as well as a range of hand tools like the Tenon saw and pin hammer.

"The feedback from our Year 7s and 8s was that they enjoyed the time spent making these products, whilst also learning and experiencing new things too.

"The students were also provided with a booklet to show them how to make their own bat or bird house, so they could have a go at making another one at home.

"One of the aims is to get students talking about how we can help protect the environment and be more aware of some of the problems it faces and how we can all support it. The time in the workshop was busy but fun."
